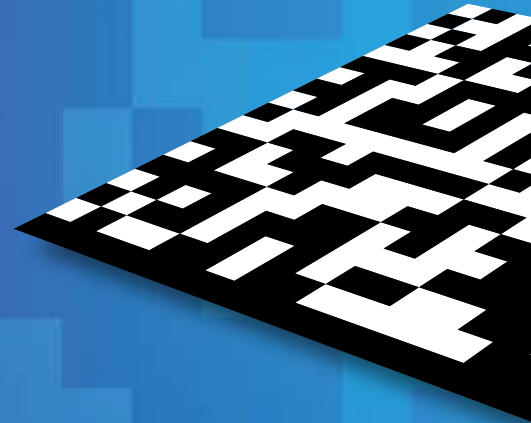

Achieving unique item level traceability, enabled by IUID, continues to grow in importance as an item visibility method to achieve business process re-engineering (e.g., warranty management, government furnished property and redeployment) both within the US DoD and the International communities. By incorporating unique item level traceability into a wide range of topics and policy documents, helps to ensure the greatest adoption of this critical effort. One example is the DoDI 5000.02, which requires Program Managers to document unique item level traceability planning and lifecycle implementation in the System's Engineering Plan (SEP) and Lifecycle Sustainment Plan (LCSP) for key milestone reviews.

In recent months, significant documents have been developed and released to further benefit the IUID Community including:

- Publication of the legacy implementation changes through the "Item Unique Identification (IUID) of Tangible Personal Property – Policy Refinement for Secondary Items in Use or in Inventory" memorandum signed by the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology and Logistics on December 30th 2010 refines the application of IUID for secondary items in use or in inventory.
- Proposed NATO changes to AAP 48, "NATO System Life Cycle Stages and Processes", to include traceability as a key process enabled by NATO codification and UID of items described in AUIDP-1.

The year ahead promises additional opportunities to truly leverage the data often collected from IUID to successfully enable other initiatives such as anti-counterfeiting and achieving government transparency for greater confidence in the capability of the acquisition community to exceed the warfighters needs and expectations. You can help demonstrate the importance and value to others, especially the industrial base, by capturing metrics of implementation, by describing how unique item traceability is used for decision-making, and by sharing your achievements. Sharing your experience is critical to accelerating implementation and to achieving the vision of an empowered global community.

Take advantage of the opportunities available to you during the event to identify and utilize the many resources available. Then proceed to turn your new knowledge into measurable value for your organization and your program or project.

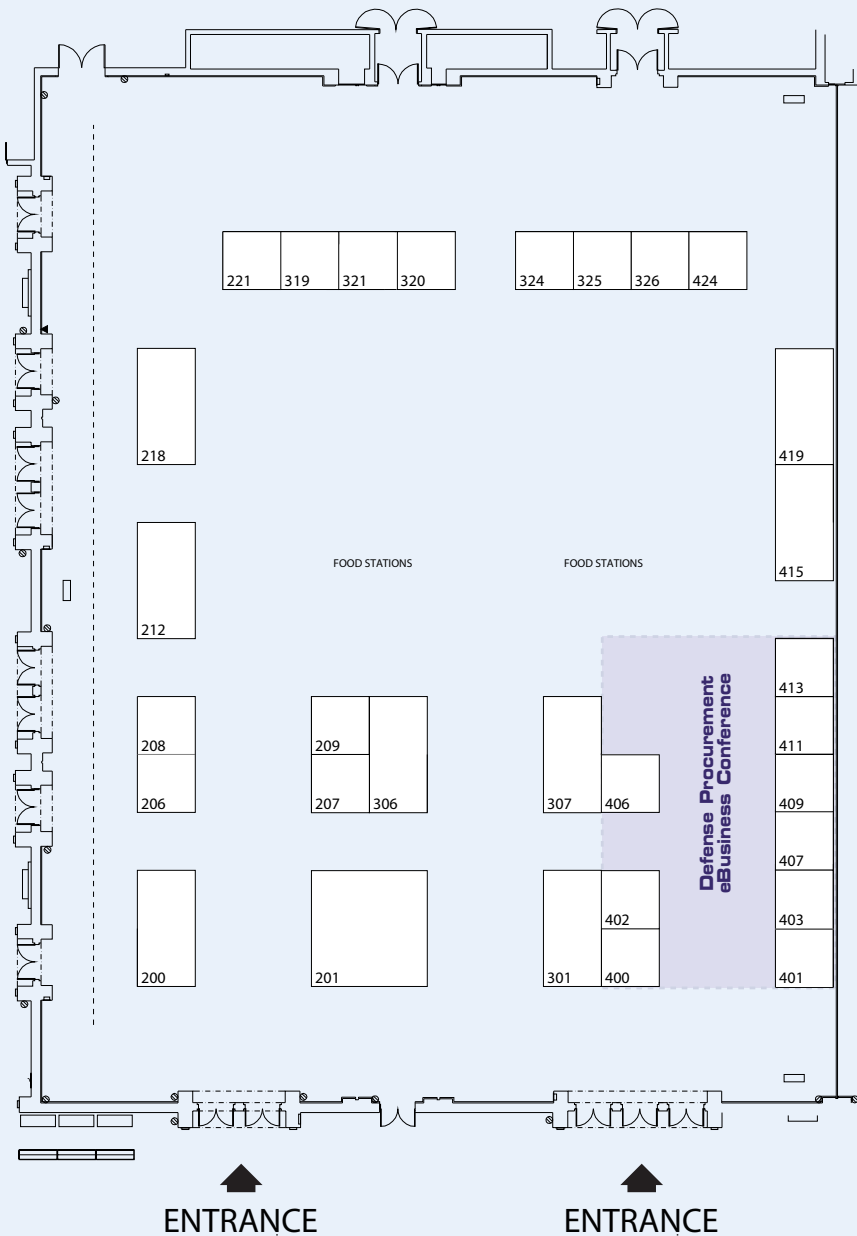

ELECTRONIC DOCUMENT ACCESS (EDA) — eda.ogden.disa.mil (select "Training Material", then select various training modules.)

Provides secure online, electronic storage and retrieval capabilities of procurement information and documents across the DoD, including Contract Deficiency Reports (CDRs).

ON-LINE REPRESENTATIONS AND CERTIFICATIONS APPLICATION (ORCA) — <https://orca.bpn.gov>

The Federal-wide web-based system that collects vendor representations and certifications related to contract solicitations.

CONTRACTOR PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT REPORTS SYSTEM (CPARS) — www.cpars.csd.disa.mil

The web-enabled application that collects and manages DoD's library of automated CPARS with three modules used to assess systems, services, IT, operations support, architect-engineer, and construction contracts.

CENTRAL CONTRACTOR REGISTRATION (CCR) — www.ccr.gov

The web-enabled, Government-wide application that collects, validates, stores, and disseminates business information about the Federal Government's trading partners. All current and potential Government contractors must be registered in CCR.

ELECTRONIC SUBCONTRACTING REPORTING SYSTEM (ESRS) — www.esrs.gov

This web-based system automates the business processes for completion and submission of Individual Subcontracting Reports (ISRs) (formerly SF294) and Summary Subcontracting Reports (SSRs) (formerly SF295) across the Federal Government.

FFATA SUBAWARD REPORTING SYSTEM (FSRS) — www.fsrs.gov

The Federal-wide web-based system that collects vendor reports of subcontracts it has awarded in response to the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act (FFATA).

CONTRACTING OFFICER REPRESENTATIVE TRACKING TOOL (CORT) — www.acq.osd.mil/dpap/pdi/eb/cor.html

This Common Access Card (CAC) enabled, web accessible management application is designed to nominate, appoint, track, revoke and terminate an individual as a COR against a DoD contract. The tool allows a COR to create a profile, document their training and experience, and process a nomination package for one or multiple contracts and orders—all in one portal.
